STREETSCAPE

The Streetscape component of Community Mental Health Programs (CMHP) is a community-based crisis and short-term assertive outreach service designed to identify, engage and provide support to adults who have a mental illness and are experiencing homelessness, or “at risk” of being homeless. Staff go out into the community and assertively seek “at risk” individuals as well as accept referrals.

A team and case management approach is taken to establish rapport with clients, plans for short and long term goals identified by the client, and the strategies that will be implemented. Goals can include housing, acquiring a health card and identification, referral to health services, and life skills development. Services include Crisis Intervention, Court Diversion, Housing Advocacy as well as access to other community agencies and resources.

We offer clients support, “safe places to be”, transitional assistance from hospital, and connection to community resources.

CRASHBED PROGRAM

Crashbeds is a safe, overnight crisis space for people who cannot, will not, or would otherwise not do well in a shelter system. Crashbeds operates year round and can be accessed from 9:00 pm to 7:00 am nightly on a first come first served basis.

This is a gender specific environment with 10 beds for women and 11 beds for men, each side having a separate entrance. Occupants receive access to nourishment, showers, support services, as well as referral to appropriate community resources for housing and other needs.

THE RESOURCE CENTRE

The Resource Centre is a friendly, multipurpose space located at 457 York Street – entrance at the west end of the building. It is open to the public weekdays from 9:30 am to 4:00 pm (closed 11:30 am to 12:30 pm). The centre provides access to telephones and computers with internet and email. This enables clients to seek housing, employment opportunities, connection to community resources, and to maintain personal relationships. Showers are available and laundry can be done free of charge.

Vocational, social and leisure programming aids in the development of skills. Additionally, we offer access to individual functional assessments, addiction assessments and referral to appropriate mental health and treatment centres.

TRANSITIONAL CASE MANAGEMENT (TCM)

The TCM team is connected to a greater Middlesex crisis services continuum. This team is tasked with engaging, connecting and assisting individuals who frequent Emergency Departments or Hospital In-Patient Health Services. Typically these individuals are orphaned from primary health care service, or are experiencing a mental health crisis without connection to resources.

For nine week engagements, the team assists individuals in accessing health, mental health, addiction and social services, resulting in fewer admissions to hospital while offering needed support.
