

Impacting Lives. More Than a Shelter

A Christian faith-based organization since 1951, **Mission Services of London** is a non-profit, social service agency, committed to serving London and area with compassion, dignity, and hope. Our focus is assisting individuals and families (regardless of background or faith) who are at risk of experiencing, or experiencing poverty, homelessness, and crisis, as well as adults suffering with addiction and mental illness. We provide safe shelter, nutritious meals, clothing, outreach, counselling, and many other support services.

We offer help through our sites and programs:

Men's Mission

459 York Street, London, ON

Men's Mission is an emergency shelter for men aged 16 and over who are experiencing chronic homelessness, are new to homelessness, or are seeking asylum as a newcomer. Men's Mission is a 111 bed facility, with 76 beds reserved for men staying up to 90 days (although the length of stay may be longer or shorter, depending on differing circumstances), and with 35 beds reserved for men working towards a positive outcome or goal. In addition to meals and accommodation, the men are provided with counselling and clothing. *T:* (519) 672-8500

Rotholme Family Shelter

42 Stanley Street, London, ON

Rotholme Family Shelter is an emergency shelter for single or dual led families. Rotholme can accommodate up to 20 families at a time. The length of stay varies depending on the needs and circumstances of individuals and families searching for housing. Families have their own room, as well as shared laundry and washroom facilities. Nutritious meals are provided. Caseworkers provide shelter diversion, housing selection, and housing stability services, as well as counselling and support to help participants transition to (and maintain) stable housing. *T:* (519) 673-4114

Quintin Warner House

457 York Street, London, ON

Quintin Warner House is a four-month, live-in addiction treatment facility that can accommodate 20 men over the of age of 18. The program includes life skills support, nutritious eating and exercise, individualized treatment plans, anger management, relapse prevention, communications training, and trauma informed safety training to promote safe coping mechanisms. Optional post-graduation services include transitional housing and referrals to community resources. *T*: (519) 434-8041

Community Mental Health Programs (CMHP)

CMHP offers services to those experiencing concerns related to homelessness or are at risk of homelessness, mental illness and/ or substance addiction. CMHP provides outreach crisis support, intensive case management, and support with mental health, and court diversion and rehabilitation. Resources like access to computers, phones, programming, and laundry facilities are also offered. *T:* (519) 433-2807
